





According to the third RDNA, a minimum investment of \$300 million per year over the next 5 years (\$1.5 billion) is needed to survey and clear explosive ordnance that is causing civilian casualties and hindering the recovery of Ukrainian communities. To sustain this level of financial commitment national and international partners will need to work together to ensure the maximum efficiency of traditional mine action approaches while incorporating cost-effective, high-impact solutions, and considering private partnerships as a way forward. The Mine Action Window of the Fund is aligned to the National Mine Action Strategy of the Government of Ukraine and targets its three pillars of clearance, explosive ordnance risk education and victim assistance.

The Fund is based on the extensive experience of the UN system in establishing and managing multi-partner trust funds in large scale recovery contexts. This includes robust risk management and monitoring systems in a Fund Secretariat hosted by the Resident Coordinator Office, to ensure transparency and accountability. It leverages the UN's track record in implementation, monitoring, and consolidated reporting with a view to strengthening the capacity of key government bodies and local communities to smoothly shift from humanitarian assistance to a human rights-based and people-centered approach to recovery and sustainable development.




